DEAR FRIENDS,

It is the week before Thanksgiving as I write this letter. Barb's father died suddenly on November 6th and she was able to quickly get a ride to the capital where she immediately got on a plane to Korea and then America. She will be returning here in a few days after being gone for two weeks. God was gracious to provide for her travel connections in such short notice, frequent flier miles for the international travel, people to pick her up from the airport and many other small details. We are also thankful that her parents recently got a Skype connection set up so Barb had been able to video chat with them during the month before he died. Back here in Tosontsengel the children have been helping me to teach them in their homeschooling and we've been doing well, but are looking forward to Barb's return.

In our July prayer letter we mentioned the possibility of our moving to the capital to work more closely with the Bible Society of Mongolia. It would appear at this time that the door to do that has been closed. I will however,

continue to work on typesetting and other computer-related issues remotely from Tosontsengel for the BSM. While it is disappointing at the present, it is nice to have clear direction for the immediate future. We plan to continue to live and work here in Tosontsengel with our teammates for the time being.

Our 2010 vegetable harvest went well and we were blessed by God with great weather during that time and brought in around 136 tons of produce. Shortly after our harvest we had our first ever company picnic with our employees and their families out at the field. Everyone had a great time - eating, playing volleyball and having tug-of-war contests.

When Guunrick's family moved downtown last year shortly before his death we had plans to renovate a small building at the front of their yard to use for ministry. After many delays the work is almost completed. Pray for God's direction that we would know best how to utilize this building for His glory. Hopefully

Continue to pray for God’s wisdom in how we can best teach them and encourage them in their faith. As our teammates have been out in the capital the past five weeks, we’ll have lots to catch up on as we plan for what ministry we should focus on this winter.
